Jan Černý remains on the podium in the WRC2 Challenger category at the Rally Monte - Carlo

After having completed the day on Friday, Jan Černý and Ondřej Krajča maintain their podium place in WRC2 Challenger, a leg in which they have won some stages throughout Friday. At the same time, the Costa Adeje Tenerife Sur and Ángel Bello Motorsport driver is fifth in WRC2, just 15 seconds behind fourth place. Tomorrow, Saturday, the longest leg of this 93 Rally Monte – Carlo will be held, the inaugural round of the World Rally Championship (WRC).

Jan Černý and Ondřej Krajča continue to increase their performance at the wheel of the Citroën C3 Rally2 with which they are competing in this first rally of the world championship (WRC). The 93 Rally Monte – Carlo is being the ideal setting to show their capacity in the WRC2 and WRC2 Challenger category where, without a doubt, they are being protagonists.

After five stages held today, Friday - the second of the day was canceled to attend some spectators-, Jan Černý and Ondřej Krajča have maintained their positions from yesterday, that is, fifth place in WRC2 and third place in WRC2 Challenger. Without a doubt, it has been a positive day, with the difficulties that the 'Monte-Carlo' always poses, but absolutely productive for their interests.

In WRC2 Challenger, those from Ángel Bello Motorsport and Costa Adeje Tenerife Sur have started to win stages today, which keeps them very close to second place. On the other hand, in WRC2 they have also approached fourth position, a goal that they now have just over 15 seconds away.

“Today went much better than yesterday”, said Jan Černý from the service area located in Gap. “In the first stage of the day, with typical conditions of this rally, the feeling were good”, said the Tenerife-based driver. “In the afternoon, on soft tyres, we faced some frozen areas, losing a bit of time on the penultimate one. In which this stage closed, with very delicate spaces and the arrival of the night, we once again showed a good pace”, he added. “We have won several stages in WRC2 Challenger, so this Saturday will be key to try to achieve a good result next Sunday”, pointed out the Citroën C3 Rally2 driver.

This Saturday will take place the longest day of the entire weekend, just over 120 km that will be tremendously important for the final leg, on Sunday, which will return the teams to Monaco.
